It's now home to 8 acres of beautifully landscaped ornamental gardens, a quality plant centre and garden shop, gallery and gift shop, museum, and tea shop. We have chosen the date on the advice of the Head Gardener so that hopefully we will see the best display of their outstandingly 'blousy' Waterperry asters.

Our day includes access to the grounds, plant shop, gift barn, gallery, and café. By visiting on a Friday, the ornamental garden is free with a current RHS card, and there is an afternoon house fresco tour too.
